- A Series of Evening Retreats
at Holy Family Passionist Retreat Center.

Holy Family Passionist Retreat Center in West Hartford is sponsoring *If We Build It, Will They Come?* - a three-part series on parish life that will take place at the retreat center this winter. Some Catholics have suggested that parish life needs to be reinvented or at least reexamined. Many pastors and parish leaders are asking themselves, how can we organize our parish communities so they better foster a sense of fellowship and community; how can the parish be a place where people are empowered to share their gifts; how can the parish respond to the needs of the greater community and world?

Part 1 – January 14, 6pm: *The Catholic Parish: Can We Live Without It?* Msgr. Larry Carroll will explore the role of the Catholic parish in today's society and how parishes can become more vibrant. The dialogue will examine the obstacles to and opportunities for creating parishes with a dynamic sense of community, a prayerful liturgy, and an active outreach. Msgr. Carroll is pastor of St. Pius X in Fairfield and Assistant Director of Clergy Personnel in the Diocese of Bridgeport.

Part 2, *Is There Really a Priesthood Shortage? If Not, Then What?* presented by Sr. Elissa Rinere, C.P. will be January 28 and part 3, *Is This the Church We Want for Our Children?* presented by Shawnee Baldwin will be February 11.

A LETTER FROM OUR BISHOP

MESSAGE FOR THE EPIPHANY
OF
THE LORD

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Sunday, January 11, 2009 marks for us again the beginning of National Vocation Awareness Week throughout the country. The celebration begins on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

This year I ask all of you to make a personal commitment to assisting me and our Vocation Office in the work of "Building a Culture of Vocation Awareness" throughout our families, schools, parishes and communities. You, the People of God, have been called by Him to make the Church and more particularly, Christ, present in the work-a-day world, and yet there are those in the family of God who are being called specifically to serve God's family, the Church, through the particular vocations of either diocesan priesthood or religious life.

Prayer, awareness, and the willingness to support those we can identify together as being called by God to serve in the vocations of priesthood or religious life is particularly important to the continued spiritual health and well being of the Church, both in our country and more particularly in our diocese.

Presently, we have six men studying for the priesthood in our diocese: Deacon Christopher Schuh who, God willing, may be called to ordination this spring; Mr. Christopher Feeney, Mr. Henry Aguielo, Mr. Jonathan Ficara, Mr. Brian Maxwell, and Mr. Ian Bothur. We also have men who are presently in the application process and many other who all are at varying points in their discernment process. Please keep all of them in your prayers.

Please also keep me, your unworthy servant, in your prayers that God, through His Holy Spirit, may continue to direct me as I seek to guide his holy people.

May Christ, the Eternal High Priest, through the intercession of Saints Patrick and Ann and Saint John Vianney, bless you and open the hearts of those He is calling to share in these particular vocations.

Why did the Magi set off from afar to go to Bethlehem? The answer has to do with the mystery of the "star" which they saw "in the East" and which they recognized as the star of the "King of the Jews," that is to say, the sign of the birth of the Messiah (Mt. 2:2). So their journey was inspired by a powerful hope, strengthened and guided by the star, which led them toward the King of the Jews, toward the kingship of God himself. The Magi set out because of the deep desire which prompted them to leave everything and begin a journey. It was as though they had always been waiting for that star. It was as if the journey had always been a part of their destiny, and was finally about to begin. This is the mystery of God's call, the mystery of vocation. It is part of the life of every Christian.... When the Magi came to Bethlehem, "going into the house they saw the child with Mary his Mother, and they fell down and worshipped him" (Mt. 2:11) Here at last was the long-awaited moment – their encounter with Jesus. "Going into the house": this house in some sense represents the Church. In order to find the Savior, one has to enter the house, which is the Church..."They fell down and worshiped him...and offered him gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh" (Mt. 2: 11-12). Here is the culmination of the whole journey: encounter becomes adoration; it blossoms into an act of faith and love which acknowledges in Jesus, born of Mary, the Son of God made man...The secret of holiness is friendship with Christ and faithful obedience to his will.
